FRESHMAN YEAR:

- Take your studies seriously and explore extracurricular opportunities. **Remember every class counts!** You are building your record for college admission beginning in your freshman year.
- Meet with our guidance counselor and set academic goals for the year.
- Take the **PSAT 8/9** seriously. Use Khan Academy to help you prepare for this test.
- Begin building your resume. Record your extracurricular activities, leadership positions, community service, honors, awards, summer experiences, and jobs. Update your extracurricular activities each semester.
- Play a Sport – Colleges love well-rounded students.
- Evaluate your grades each quarter and determine what you are doing well and what you need to improve.
- Take your **Midterm Exams and Finals** seriously – **they count!**
- Begin exploring career paths and vocational options.
- In the spring, meet with our guidance counselor to discuss coursework for your Sophomore year.
- Begin thinking about colleges /universities that interest you. Do online research or visit campuses close to you.
- Consider giving some of your time this summer to regular volunteering or participate on a mission trip.
- Consider going to church camp or engage in some other discipleship building activities.
- Consider attending a **Summer Program or Academic Camp** that gives you exposure to or experience in areas of intellectual or vocational interest.

SOPHOMORE YEAR:

- Review your 9th grade progress and review your academic goals with our guidance counselor. **The time has passed for fun and games – get serious and do your best in every class!**
- If you are strong in a particular subject or subjects, consult with your teachers and guidance counselor about taking Advanced Placement courses.
- Evaluate your grades each quarter and determine what you are doing well and what you need to improve.
- Take your **Midterm Exams and Finals** seriously – **they count!**
- Take the **PSAT 10** in the spring. Use Khan Academy to help you prepare for this test.
- Continue to explore career paths and vocational options.
- Continue to update your resume.
- Meet with our guidance counselor in the spring to discuss coursework for your Junior year.
- Continue exploring colleges/universities that interest you. Do online research and consider visiting schools that are of interest to you.
- Consider giving some of your time this summer to regular volunteering or participate on a mission trip.
- Consider going to church camp or engage in some other discipleship building activities.
- Consider attending a **Summer Program or Academic Camp** that gives you exposure to or experience in areas of intellectual or vocational interest.

GUIDANCE

JUNIOR YEAR:

- Review your 10th grade progress and your academic plan with our guidance counselor. **This is the last full year that college admissions counselors will consider – make it count.**
- Continue to update the resume you began as a freshman.
- Make use of the college planning resources available from the guidance office. Also, take advantage of the internet; the websites of various colleges and universities can be useful tools for college exploration.
- Prepare for the October **PSAT**. While this is still a practice test for the SAT- juniors who score exceptionally well on the PSAT may be considered for participation in the National Merit Scholarship competition. **This test matters** – be prepared and do your best.
- Attend scheduled trips to college fairs and be sure to meet with some of the many college representatives who are at these events. Listen to the admission counselors' presentation, and ask questions about your particular interests. Pick up admission materials and sign the information cards provided by the reps so that you will be added to the school's mailing lists.
- Evaluate your 1st quarter grades and determine what you are doing well and what you need to improve to meet your academic goals for the year. The grade point average provided to colleges when you apply is cumulative through the end of the junior year.
- **Do well on your midterm exams!**
- Register for April ACT and the May SAT. Use Khan Academy to help prepare for these tests.
- Submit preliminary list of potential college choices to our guidance counselor in the spring when you meet to plan your senior year.
- Schedule family visits to colleges.
- Take your first ACT Exam.
- Take your first SAT Exam.
- Prepare diligently for Final Exams.
- Consider taking a Summer SAT/ACT Prep Class.

JUNIOR YEAR (continued):

- Narrow down your potential college choices to the finalists.
- Review application requirements for all possible college choices.
- Think about essay topics.
- Think about teachers who can write a letter of recommendation.
- Search for student scholarships for which you may qualify. Explore the opportunities, requirements, and deadlines.
- Consider giving some of your time this summer to regular volunteering or participate on a mission trip.
- Consider going to church camp or engage in some other discipleship building activities.
- Consider attending a Summer Program or Academic Camp that gives you exposure to or experience in areas of intellectual or vocational interest.

SENIOR YEAR:

- Meet with our guidance counselor within the first two weeks of school to discuss college and career goals.
- Apply for all colleges that have early and/or rolling application periods.
- Remember to request transcripts in a timely manner.
- Register for the September **ACT exam** and the October **SAT exam**.
- Request teacher recommendations, if you did not do so yet.
- Continue to apply for any college that has an early application period.
- **Explore Scholarship Opportunities, Requirements, Deadlines.**
- Prepare diligently for Mid-term Exams – Colleges will look at first semester grades.
- Meet in January with our guidance counselor to update college process.
- Register for February ACT or March SAT, if needed.
- Prepare diligently for your final high school exams.
- **Finish in a strong and encouraging place. Leave a positive legacy behind at OCP.**

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Orlando Christian Prep is very excited to announce we have expanded our dual enrollment program that will be offered to your child throughout their high school career at OCP. We have partnered with Southeastern University (SEU) to provide courses for your child that will count simultaneously towards both high school and college credit. SEU is a Christian university located in Lakeland, Florida. SEU is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. This is the same accreditation as public universities in the state of Florida.

These courses will be offered on our OCP campus in a safe and familiar Christian atmosphere. All courses will be taught by OCP teachers who hold a Master's Degree in their field. The teachers have gone through the credentialing process with SEU and are considered adjunct professors. All courses are fully transferable to both in state and out of state colleges and universities.

These courses will be an additional fee per course of only \$75. This covers the cost of course textbook and SEU keeping their official college transcript. This is a huge savings to our school families compared to the cost of \$2,436 at Southeastern University or \$636.84 at the University of Central Florida.

National Honors Society Eligibility Requirements:

Students in grades 10–12 who meet the requirements for membership outlined by their school’s chapter are eligible to be invited for membership.

- **Scholarship** Per national guidelines, at a minimum, students must have a cumulative GPA of 85, B, 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, or equivalent standard of excellence. (Each school chapter is allowed to require a higher cumulative GPA.)
- **Service** This involves voluntary contributions made by a student to the school or community, done without compensation.
- **Leadership** Student leaders are those who are resourceful, good problem solvers, and idea contributors. Leadership experiences can be drawn from school or community activities while working with or for others.
- **Character** The student of good character is cooperative; demonstrates high standards of honesty and reliability; shows courtesy, concern, and respect for others; and generally maintains a clean disciplinary record.

Students who meet the scholarship requirement will have an opportunity to complete a form detailing their accomplishments in and commitment to service, leadership, and character.



National JUNIOR Honors Society Eligibility Requirements:

Students in grades 6–8 who meet the requirements for membership outlined by their school’s chapter are eligible to be invited for membership. Students must be in their second semester of sixth grade for consideration.

- **Scholarship** Per national guidelines, at a minimum, students must have a cumulative GPA of 85, B, 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, or equivalent standard of excellence. (Each school chapter is allowed to require a higher cumulative GPA.)
- **Service** This involves voluntary contributions made by a student to the school or community, done without compensation.
- **Leadership** Student leaders are those who are resourceful, good problem solvers, and idea contributors. Leadership experiences can be drawn from school or community activities while working with or for others.
- **Character** The student of good character is cooperative; demonstrates high standards of honesty and reliability; shows courtesy, concern, and respect for others; and generally maintains a clean disciplinary record.
- **Citizenship** The student who demonstrates citizenship understands the importance of civic engagement; has a high regard for freedom and justice; respects the U.S. form of government; respects the law for all citizens at the local, state, and federal levels; and demonstrates mature participation and responsibility in activities such as scouting, community organizations, or school clubs.

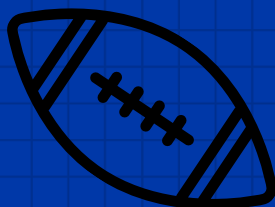

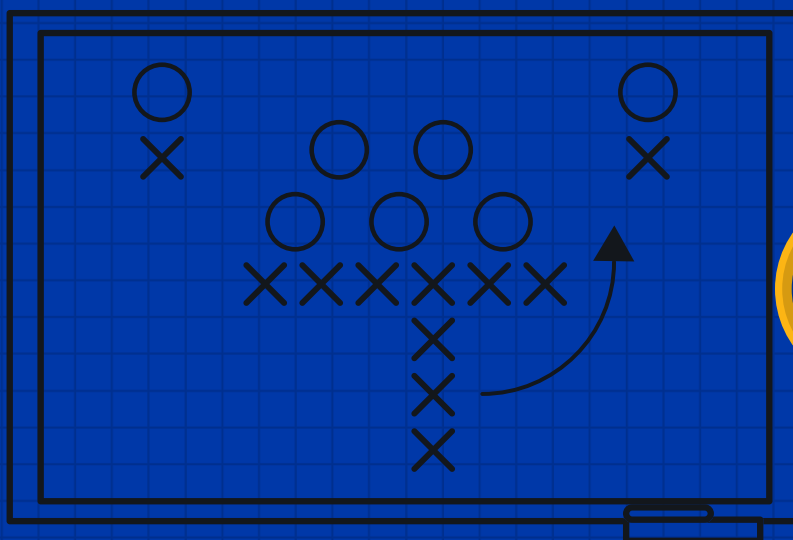

F O O D S E R V I C E

My name is Kathie Rehm, and I have been the lunchroom manager at OCP for the last 21 years. I am a mother of four and grandmother of three. My children all attended OCP, and now my grandchildren are here. I consider it a joy and privilege to serve and love on the students who come through our school. Over the years, we have become one of the best lunch programs in the area, with food cooked right on sight and a variety of options. The students really enjoy purchasing lunches. We offer a balanced hot lunch each day. A few of our favorites are chicken nuggets, spaghetti, taco salad and meatball subs.

Students may also choose from other options if they do not want hot lunch. Elementary students may choose from sack lunches, and secondary students have a larger range of foods to choose from such as salad bar, baked potato, pizza, and much more.

Our lunch ordering process is set up on RenWeb. Our monthly menus are posted on RenWeb, and you can choose to order your lunches for the whole month or a week at a time. Lunches are to be ordered each day by 8:15am. They need to be paid for at the time of ordering. They will not be processed completely until the payment goes through. Teachers will no longer place orders for students so we ask that parents order and pay for their student's lunches so that teachers may start class right away.

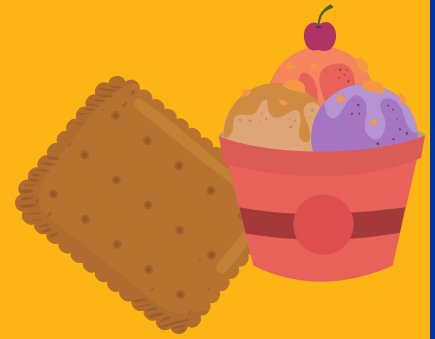

If your student checks out early from school, before eating lunch, it is their responsibility to let the lunchroom know that they need to cancel their lunch.

Emergencies happen and sometimes you may need to charge a lunch. (Your student's lunch may have been left in the car, or you may have forgotten to pack a lunch). We will allow charging a lunch when an emergency arises. Just stop by the lunchroom (or call) and let us know that your student will need to charge a lunch. Please plan on paying for the charge by the next day.

FOOD SERVICE (continued)



SNACKS:

In our lunchroom, we also have snack items that the students may purchase. We have chips, snack cakes, granola bars, fruit, cookies, ice cream, and more. Students may purchase these items during lunch time or after school. We also serve breakfast items in the morning before classes begin such as bagels, poptarts, sausage biscuits, cereal, and more.

Students may purchase snack items with cash. If you prefer, you may place funds on your RenWeb family account for your student to use for snack items. To place money on your account, you will need to sign in to your RenWeb account. Go to Family Information, click on Food Service, pay now. You will place the amount you want to add to your account, and this will take you to the payment page. You will need to let your student know that you have placed money on your account for them to use for snacks and what their budget is to spend each day. They will let the lunchroom staff know that they are using funds on their account to purchase their snacks. Charges will not be allowed on their account if there are not funds to cover the purchase.

****Please note that placing funds on your account for snacks is not the same as ordering lunches. These are two separate functions that need to be processed separately.**

MICROWAVES:

Microwaves are available for students in 2nd through 12th grade to use. To make it easier for your student to heat up their food, we ask that you send the food already cooked in a plastic container, so they only have to warm it up for a minute or two. Do not send in food items that need to be completely prepared and cooked at the time of their lunch period. This process takes up too much of their lunch period, and they won't have enough time to eat.

Would you like to volunteer and help sometimes in the lunchroom? There are times that we could use the extra help, and we welcome you to let us know that you would like to volunteer. Just stop by and talk to me.

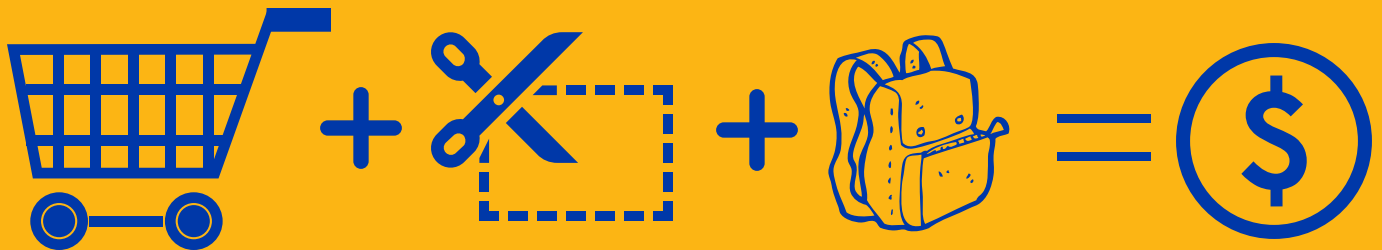

BOX TOPS:

OCP participates in Box Top 4 Education. By collecting box tops and turning them in, our school is able to purchase items like our lunchroom tables, a new oven for the kitchen, a laminator machine for our teachers and many other things.

During the year, we have class competitions. We will send home notes letting you know when the contest begins. Students will begin to turn in their box tops to their teachers. Winning classes earn a pizza party or an ice cream party. All you need to do is start watching for participating products and clip and save the box tops. Box tops must have an expiration date on them. For each box top we submit, we receive a DIME. Last year we earned \$1,760. We could earn even more if everyone helps by clipping and saving.

IMAGINARIUM COLLECTION

The Imaginarium is home to over 10,000 books, movies and magazines for all ages. Check-outs are available for all students, parents and teachers. Students begin checking-out books on their own during their Kindergarten year. Prior to that, students may borrow books if they are with their parents.

ACCELERATED READER

The Imaginarium is "AR Central!" All elementary OCP students participate in Accelerated Reader, which is a program designed to improve reading

skills by having students take short reading comprehension quizzes as they finish books that fit their reading level. Each student is given a personal goal that is based on his/her own ability as determined by the STAR reading assessment, which they'll take 3-4 times per year so we can see their growth. OCP elementary teachers integrate AR into student reading grades in some way. In the Imaginarium, we also try to keep it fun by providing prizes as students earn AR points, a "Point Club" board recognizing those students who have reached certain point levels, and trophies each year to the students with the most points overall. This has really helped independent reading to go up at OCP!

EVENTS & VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Two Scholastic Book Fairs are hosted each year in the Imaginarium. If you're looking for a quiet, air-conditioned place to get some volunteer hours completed, the book fair, and the Imaginarium in general, are great places to get that done. There are always projects in a library: cleaning, cataloging, labeling, organizing, re-shelving and more!

STUDENT SERVICES

Orlando Christian Prep's student support office exists for students who may need academic help in addition to their classroom instruction. We also support families with Individual Education Plans and 504 Plans and aid in the process of re-evaluation.

Mrs. Amy Hodges, our instructional support teacher, works with OCP's on-campus speech therapists, occupational therapists and tutors. Additionally, she collaborates with OCPS Non-Public Services office to ensure our students receive the developmental and academic support they need. OCP currently offers the following Student Support Services:

- Pull-out reading support for kindergarten-sixth grade students who are below grade level in reading or who are potentially at-risk for below grade level performance
- Academic Plan support for middle and high school students via the Academic Plan process, in which homework and grades are reviewed weekly and students are encouraged and challenged to be accountable for their academic performance
- College Testing Accommodation support for high school students who have Individual Education Plans, who are using their current accommodations and are seeking accommodations on the ACT and College Board-SAT and AP testing
- Coordination with the Title 1 Catapult Learning teacher, an on-campus tutor provided by the State of Florida in which struggling students receive support (K-5th during school and 6-12th after school) based upon their address and public school zone
- Coordination for speech therapy screenings and subsequent therapy with Step to Success, Director Pam Reeser, MA CCC/SLP (P) 407-383-7082, (Fax) 321-400-5172, pam@istep2success.com, www.pediatricdevelopmentaltherapy.com

- Coordination with classroom teachers to identify and assess students who may need reading support, an academic plan, tutoring, or screening for therapies
- Ensure that all students' accommodations are identified and received by all teachers and that teachers have access to their students' accommodations as stated in IEP's, 504 Plans, or Official Accommodation Plans.
- Affirmation with OCPS Non-Public Services by identifying students who may be eligible for support services through Child Find in Orange County.

Before and after school care is important at Orlando Christian Prep. We take a lot of pride in this program. Our morning care is open and available to families starting at 7:00am. Students can be signed in and dropped off in the lunchroom. Our after care program begins at 3:30pm. If your student is not picked up, after school, by 3:30pm, your student will be sent directly to after care.

\$78 - Monthly rate for Morning Care only

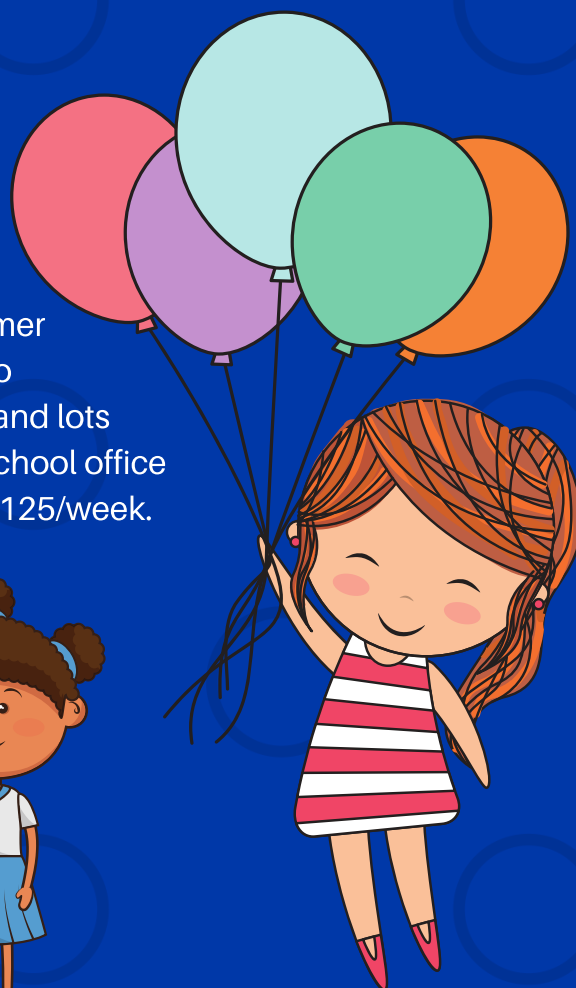
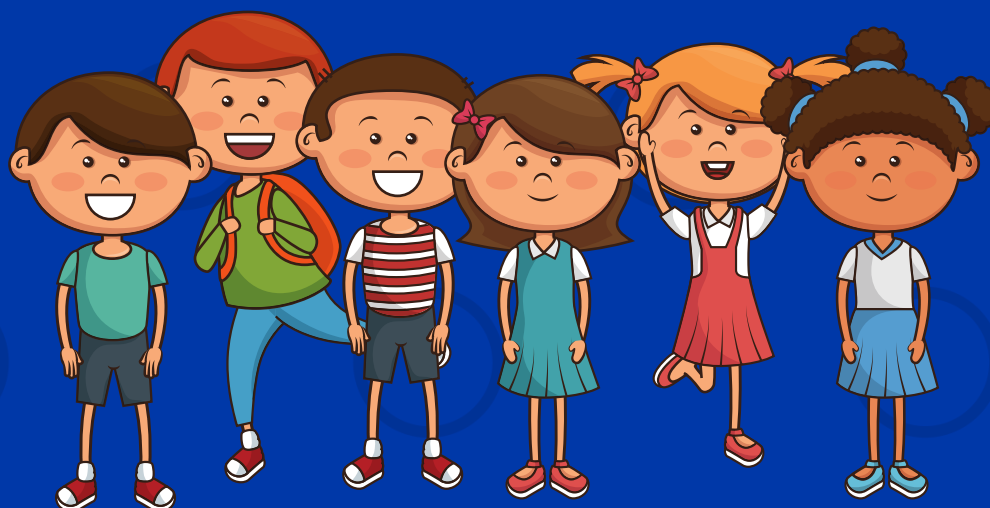

RENWEB

Renweb is the online communication that we use at OCP. New parents created a login and password during the enrollment process, and current parents can use their existing login. This website (and/or app) may be used to monitor grades, behavior, attendance, and homework, as well as see report cards and order lunch.

Please note, access to Renweb will be restricted if there are overdue balances on the account.
